## BYLAW NO. 2/66

## A BYLAW OF THE VILLAGE OF MARQUIS TO REGULATE THE KEEPING OF LIVE-STOCK WITHIN THE VILLAGE LIMITS.

The Council of the Village of Marquis in the Province of Saskatchewan, enacts as follows: -

## 1. Definitions -

<u>Livestock</u> shall mean and include cattle, horses, pigs, sheep, goats, chickens, turkeys, ducks, geese, pigeons, rabbits, and all other animals and birds except dogs, cats, or household pets normally kept within the confines of a residence.

Keeping of livestock shall mean, in addition to maintaining animals or birds on the premises, the feeding or harboring of same whether or not they are owned by the occupant of any premises within the defined areas as set out in this bylaw.

- 2. No person shall herd livestock at any time within the limits of the Village.
- 3. No person shall graze any livestock, nor shall any livestock be permitted to graze at any time within the limits of the Village.
- 4. No person shall keep any livestock or poultry at any time within the area bounded by Maharg Street, Railway Avenue, Brownlee Street, McFadden Avenue, Thomas Street, Prairie Avenue, George Street, McFadden Avenue to Maharg Street.
- 5. No person shall keep any livestock or poultry at any time beyond the area designated in Section 4 hereof except within a barn, shed, or poultry pen especially erected for such purpose and approved by the Village council.
- 6. Any person found guilty of an infraction of any of the provisions of this bylaw shall be liable to the penalties provided in the General Penalty Bylaw of the Village.
- 7. Bylaw No. 1/56, passed May 2, 1956 is hereby repealed.
